

DELMAR TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISOR

MINUTES

AUGUST 5, 2024

The workshop meeting was held at the Delmar Township building at 6 PM.

Joseph Hastings, Roadmaster, said that the mowing boom tractor broke again and out of commission. Supervisors spoke to look for another boom mower. Diesel tanks are to have inspection on Tuesday morning. All driveway pipe applications are completed. The crew has been ditching. Gravel has been added to roads from washing approx. 400 tons used of 2A stone and additional was ordered of 300 Ton more. PennDOT project with Heise Run Road is coming along. Trees have been a major factor as the storms making them fall on Marsh Creek had consumed a lot of time. Sweet Briar Road had to be cleaned up from water running. The supervisor asked for updated Tar and Chip list for 2025 and Garry mentioned Buck road to be added for next year.

Julia Heath, Secretary, went over the agenda with the supervisors. Old business information was tossed for this meeting. Jeff Brooks has three other projects in our township for eco flows. Garry mentioned tax base needs to come up for paying the cost-of-living increase and materials for the road maintenance to keep maintaining it as liquid fuels money is dwindling down every year. Budget meeting will be scheduled for Sept 3rd @ 5 PM. Deven mentioned as well to call the bank and see about a 9 month CD to make some interest off the impact fee money. Julia received an estimate for the trees for Balsam and Pheasant Hill Road asking what they plan on doing with it and Deven stated there are many factoring issues with the road. Julia explained those trees have protected that home from accidents hitting the home and how can it replaced if destroyed.

An executive meeting was held at 6:45 about new hires. Setting their hiring wage at 19.25 and hour and in 6 months \$1 raise per union contract in January. At 6:57 PM it was adjourned.
